

# Top 10... Flesh on the bones version

## 1 Britain's legal trade must put its house in order

Britain's legal professionals earned the honorary title of 'pillars of the community' when they buttressed democracy, stood firm for civilised values, protected national integrity and through the application of justice, ensured the triumph of right over wrong. That however is not what all of those currently working as legal operatives stand for. A sizeable number have morphed into becoming the country's most ruthless breed of businesspeople that will stop at nothing, including the endangerment of their own country, in pursuance of cash.

Feral attitudes, a defeatist mindset, and despair of the future all rife.

Question... Isn't it about time the military covenant we now understand and appreciate, should be joined by a matching civilian one? And were that to be the case, what do you suppose might be the effect upon 'A' the quality of our political representatives? And 'B' quality of life for the populous? It's my opinion that both would greatly improve, which is precisely what we need.

### **3 Britain is full**

Nothing demonstrates better the need for responsible governance, than that the nation's borders have been undefended over the past two decades, allowing millions to waltz in. If they are employed and doing a worthwhile job, give them a work permit for a limited time, but deny access to all benefits other than emergency NHS treatment in a life threatening situation.

The fears being generated that include the flight of hundreds of thousands of Brits, who're in despair at the state of the country, whilst others begin taking fascists seriously, are all the reasons we need to get a grip. #### **4 Jobs and the Economy**

There is only one fair and equitable way to generate and maintain a balanced and functional society. We should be aiming to run a high skills economy, because this will enable ordinary Brits to employ their talents acquiring a skill, that will give them personally a career, and the nation a living asset. Also and perhaps even more importantly, high quality employment is the most just way to distribute wealth. Skilled workers within a creative economy should be self sufficient financially. Such jobs should not require the prop of 'tax credits' but should on the contrary, inject through normal taxation, money into the system.

What's just been described is what existed before the nation lost the plot. Pre-Thatcher Britain was indeed a nation of craftspeople, all grafting away, paying more into the system than they were taking out, performing as high quality role models to their children, and generating community and national identity. But then it all went horribly wrong because 'Thatcherism' is a wrongheaded philosophy that spawned a lazy, selfish and destructive business culture.

Three decades ago forces came together that have cost the British masses both their social cohesion and their futures. City dealers formulated a plan to flog off national assets and had no trouble selling the idea to Mrs T. At the same time our captains of industry woke up to the availability of labour that could be had dirt cheap in the third and developing worlds. And as if that wouldn't cost many a community its future, the same lot also realised how valuable were the commercial assets they had control over.

Previous generations of far more worthy industrialists had laid down powerful foundations, and then built upon them a solid mass of industrial heritage. Sadly though, the work ethic of their forebears didn't pass down the generations, but instead a nasty and lazy asset stripping mentality came to dominate the modern 'big business' mindset. The current lot realised they had under their command, valuable assets and couldn't resist selling both the heritage and our entire nation to

the highest bidder. It's happened time and time again, as Britain's famous brands have been sold to foreigners, by the world's lousiest and most handicapping breed of big business pimps. These have without regard for their national responsibilities or the welfare of their countrymen, sold the ground out from beneath all of our feet.

Thirty years so far, have witnessed the divorcing of leadership from populous. The wholesale deindustrialisation of Britain as quite literally millions of skilled jobs has been decanted abroad. Ownership of GB plc has largely shifted into the hands of foreign corporate boardrooms. Our skill based economy has been in the main, downgraded to a shelf stacking of imports one. The national wealth is being transfused at a suicidal rate, into the economies of competitors, to pay for the imports deluging in upon us. And what little manufacturing that remains, is now largely being run by foreign regimes, which means those profits also, are being creamed off and sent abroad.

In 2010 Britain has been reduced to a low skill subservient to foreigner's economy that functions as a cash-cow convenient to them. We're under the thumb, have surrendered our commercial sovereignty, and the populous largely been reduced from 'owners-occupiers' of GB plc to mere 'tenants' living under foreign jurisdiction. Most telling of all though and by a very long chalk, is the cancerous 'benefits culture' that has developed over the timeframe.

Being paid to sit on your backside and do nothing all day has become viewed as legitimate. Why work when your neighbours will pay for your mobile phone, car running costs and SKY subscription no questions asked? And how quickly the work-shy mentality has imbedded! Ask any individual that doesn't work and is making no attempt to find employment... how come? They'll give you chapter and verse as to why the world owes them a living. And they're everywhere. The nation is being dragged down by millions of their sorts, content to ride upon their neighbours backs whilst making no attempt whatsoever to pull their own weight. Ultimately leaderless, fragmenting, increasingly feral and feckless Britain has become the western world's most dysfunctional nation.

Under the current regime the rich have unquestioningly become richer, which equates to an 'upward redistribution of wealth' at their less well off countrymen's expense. These have sold us all down the river whilst trousering a mountain of foreign cash for themselves. And that I'm sorry to say is the blunt truth about Britain's spiv businessman and their lousy culture.

Those atop the hierarchy are loyal to their own personal bank balances only. They don't give a damn about their ordinary countrymen, nor such a concept as 'nationhood'. On the contrary, their self-serving mindset is standard amongst the breed. And these we hardly need remind ourselves, are the people in total command over Britain's commercial interests. No wonder the country is in such an almighty mess!

Is there nothing left for ordinary Brits other than despair? If you're a snivelling defeatist yes, but if you care at all about the future and all of our children's inheritance, the answer must be no.

We mustn't kid ourselves to the scale of the task before us. It will take decades to put Britain back to rights and we'll probably never get back the wealth we had before our political and commercial leaders divorced themselves from their responsibilities. Century's worth of wealth laid down by our ancestors has gone. The already rich in command of British commerce helped themselves to it. Then Britain's new foreign owners raided the nations pent up wealth as well, these being free to do so because the country was undefended and prone.

We've a heck of a job on our hands and that's for sure. We need a new business culture and

therefore a new breed of businesspeople. And we must rebuild a healthy relationship between those who lead and the general populous. There really isn't an alternative, because currently the 'future' looks about as bleak as it could possibly be, therefore we've no choice other than to psyche ourselves up and meet the challenge.

## **5 The European Union**

The controlling minority in favour of membership have had more than three decades to make their experiment work in the interests of Britain and its peoples. This they have abjectly failed to do.

Our political sovereignty has been surrendered for no gain. We've adopted an entirely subservient and apologetic mindset. We're subject to an outrageous bureaucracy that has tied us up in red tape and stultified normal life. Billions of pounds we plainly cannot afford are being wasted on membership subs. And because we are where we are 'human responsibilities' must be put centre stage. No one has the right to impose criminal intent and attitude upon their neighbours, on the contrary, such bad attitude is a societal ill that must be addressed and neutralised.

As to who might be entrusted to design such a bill for Britain? Anglophile legal professionals from around the English speaking world maybe? I cannot help but question whether our own lot are up to it, their institutional failure having been both so comprehensive and spectacular.

The proposed bill of rights and responsibilities must be designed for everyone, not just the ordinary populous. Our political, commercial and legal leaders too, must understand what their duties are. Currently we're living in a land becoming ever more divided and that is a wholly bad thing. There are two possibilities. We put our fragmenting society back together and accept our responsibilities to each other and the marriage of leadership to populous gets repaired. Or we continue dividing, looking out for number one and squabbling over an increasingly crowded landmass. Of the two options, which makes more sense?

## **7 Pussyfooting around terrorists**

What could better illustrate the malevolent power of Political Correctness, that that the British have become cowed and impotent in the face of aggressive Islamism? We've in our midst the sworn enemies of democracy and civilised values. New York's twin towers were attacked and brought down, resulting in the obscene and humiliating spectacle of Islamists openly celebrating in Britain.

Four gullible British Moslems surrendered their free will and intelligence to some ultra cynical warlord or other. They then dispatch themselves into oblivion, and whilst doing so, murder 52 innocent people and maim hundreds more. A few weeks later another four biological robots attempt a carbon copy attack, but mercifully their bombs fail to explode.

Then a Danish cartoonist provides yet another excuse to go on the rampage, and we suffer the spectacle of a rabble of nutcases parading slogans of hate and intolerance in London, one of whom even sported in public a mock suicide vest. And this we should remind ourselves, is just weeks after the bus and tube bombings.

Over the timeframe all manner of side shows have been going on. Hate gets openly preached not just in mosques, but in the open air too. Why? To get a bigger audience obviously and sow seeds of fear as far and wide as possible. We've the spectacle of 'celebrity' hate clerics, paraded

regularly across our TV screens. Footage of suicide bombings from around the world features on the news nightly. Even the 'wit and wisdom' of fundamentalist pin-up Bin Laden gets broadcast time and time again to the delight of those stupid enough to be taken in by this cynical and cowardly man. An individual that delights in sending others to their deaths, whilst staying well out of harms way himself.

Legal cases are brought left, right and centre, all of which attract a great deal of media attention. A schoolgirl demands the right to wear full Islamic dress, and a teacher likewise demands the 'right' to sit before her class, effectively wearing a tent. Planning applications for mosques overpowering in scale, get submitted and approved by planning departments desperate to adhere to PC doctrine. The objectionable factor here being that these buildings convey power and the creeping colonisation of Britain to an alien belief system. Most intolerable of all, is that our soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan get abused in the streets of their own country, and even whilst recovering from injuries in NHS hospitals.

For ten years at least, our newspapers and broadcasts have been packed full of such material. This results with the fermentation of much fear amongst a host population that feels itself to be under siege. And it is this that enables the BNP to recruit those who feel abandoned by their own government.

Too much fear has been allowed to build up and is not justified. We shouldn't be retreating in the face such aggression and abuse, but should reverse the process and neutralise the threat. Think on this...

Before migrants arrived in large numbers from the Indian subcontinent, the only Moslems in Britain were likely to be a few merchant seamen that had settled, probably in and around port towns. These would be peaceful and decent people just as the majority of British Moslems are today, that just want to get on with their lives and live in harmony. Now though, troublemakers plague Moslem communities, seeking to radicalise the young and stir up hatred and division.

Whether incomers like to admit it or not, Islam along with Hinduism, Sikhism and every other non Christian or Pagan belief system, are effectively 'guest faiths' in Britain. These may now qualify as being established faiths, but they are not of the 'establishment'. They haven't been here nearly long enough to warrant that status, 50 or 60 years being nothing compared to Christianity and Paganism. Even Judaism only rates as a 'guest faith' despite its much longer association with Britain, and despite that people of the Jewish faith occupy many powerful positions in society.

The point I'm making as a firm believer that Darwin was absolutely right about evolution, and that religion is a man made concept... Is that no 'guest' has the right to enter Britain and begin throwing weight around in an aggressive manner. That is bang out of order, is totally unacceptable, and should result with the 'guest' being shown the door.

Three last words on the subject...

1. If you want to live in Britain and enjoy its history of tolerance and peaceful coexistence, respect the host population, fit in and integrate, or ship out and lets be rid of you. There are lots more countries in the world, so if this one doesn't suit, go find another.
2. You don't pussyfoot around a cancer. On the contrary, you hit it hard with everything you've got. You starve it of nutriment and you attack it with everything in your armoury, because if you don't kill it... It will kill you.
3. Nothing about this subject is more important to understand than this... We must rid ourselves of this unjust threat and give normal life and peaceful coexistence a chance to re-establish. The Islamists themselves are not enemy No1, and that's because they are reliant

upon others for their ability to beat the system and operate freely. Those who operate as 'legal minders' truly are the enemy within, because these provide the enemies of democracy with a cloak of legal protection. Expose them for the traitors they are. Drag them out kicking and screaming into the light of day, so all can see who they are, what they've done, how much money they've gained for their treachery at yours and my expense. And I predict such people will not enjoy the attention. I think being placed centre stage will wake them up to the people's fury, and force them to change their ways. Ultimately we need Islamists to be stripped of their legal protection and become fully exposed to natural and proper justice. ## **8 Family Values**

This has to be the trickiest and most daunting subject of all to address. Britain has become the land of the dysfunctional family, and to wade into the issue, could be viewed as an attack upon children. I've no interest or desire to upset young Brits, even though many of those in question may be downright feral. On the contrary, the thrust of this entire project is the pressing need to halt our national decline, and create for every child a worthy future. Especially those being failed doubly, both by inadequate parents and by the establishment.

Irresponsible breeding blights the country like never before. The feral and feckless are popping out kids left, right and centre, with no eye upon a safe and secure upbringing for their offspring. Vast numbers are fatherless, the male having done little more than inseminate a female and set her on course to become a burden on the state and all of her neighbours. What sort of 'father figure' is a clerk at the DHS dishing out undeserved and un-worked for benefits? Children need a high quality male role model to nurture them and guide them through life. A handout paid into the mothers bank account, is about as inadequate a replacement for a 'dad' as could be!

Of all supposedly 'civilised' western nations, Britain leads the pack where divorce, teenage pregnancies, one parent families, broods sired by multiple males, households where no adult works and the likes are concerned. All this is as telling as could be about a country to have lost its way, along with its moral backbone and family values.

This has to be the most socially destructive consequence of the divorce between leadership and populous. Whilst those at the head of the pecking order have been helping themselves to the nation's wealth. They've left the masses without leadership and all that goes with being a fully functional and civilised society. That is to say peace of mind, security, jobs and the ability to be a proper and traditional 'role model' especially if you're a male with wholesome set of values, and you want to father your children properly. Instead, life has become ever more difficult and unsatisfying, but worst of all is the 'benefits culture' that has come to blight society, and that serves as the driving force behind Britain's social collapse.

Currently we've a large and growing proportion of youngsters, blighted through growing up in a moral and cultural desert. We've got to do something about that. A bill of Rights and Responsibilities and its strict enforcement will begin the process of righting the nation. Reconnecting leadership and populous is vital. And the building of a business model to serve the needs of the majority through bringing back 'real jobs' and thus, setting out to repair our basket case economy is a third constructive element.

Personal attitudes are where the single biggest change and improvement must come. Young women whose own potential becomes stultified when they take the easy option of motherhood,

a council flat and benefits, must have their horizons and expectations of life expanded. And likewise, our young men must be wised up to their responsibilities and not expect to walk away from fatherhood. If you were man enough to take your pleasure without a condom, then you must expect to take responsibility for the inevitable result, by raising your daughter or son, all the way to adulthood.

Dare to imagine how many children there are in Britain now, that are entirely cut off from their paternal roots? They'll be attached to their mothers family naturally, but to the worst off of them 'daddy' doesn't exist. That's tragic isn't it? It must stunt their own development. There's likely to be a great void of knowledge, they may well become aware of some way down the line. And it's a disaster for the nation that so many are cut off from 50% of their root stock.

This may well be both the single direst consequence of thirty years worth of lousy governance, and the most daunting social problem we face. The fact is though; we do have to square up to it, for the sake of the next and consequent generations.

## **9 Education**

The future of Britain depends upon how well educated the upcoming generation is, and the overall condition of the country. Is it safe and secure? Is it a hothouse of creativity? Is the psychology of the populous sound, to the point that we can believe in ourselves and our nation?

Not a good start is it? The nation is anything but 'secure', national creativity is hanging by a thread and the psychology of our cowed peoples is shot to ribbons. And that just about sums up the condition of the country in which all of our children are growing up. Where quality of schooling is concerned, that issue reflects with alarming accuracy, the attitudes and conditions common within every element of 'national life' today.

Bullying is rife as is classroom disruption. Decades ago under Tory rule, discipline began to breakdown, a situation that has steadily worsened as time has passed. I believe the problem is generated from the notion of 'one sided rights' that blights society today. For decades the receptive have had drummed into them the notion that... 'The world revolves around me'. I can do whatever I like. I can inflict myself upon anyone I might choose to victimise. And nobody has the right to tell me off.

How often do the likes of teachers and police officers hear out of the mouths of the feral... 'I know my rights, you can't touch me'? This represents in my opinion, the starting point for our nationwide loss of discipline that has sabotaged for most of a generation, its education.

Two other blights sabotage effective teaching, and they are the common ones afflicting all Britain's institutions. Political Correctness is the first, which interferes with the day to day running of the profession, but also dictates what gets taught. Whilst the other blight is of course government generated bureaucracy, which never ceases to become more complex and stultifying with every edict.

Teachers have to preside over endless testing that result in league tables. These cause schools to compete as though they were businesses. Others though and I suspect the majority, will be from decent families, but ones unfortunate enough to have become trapped in communities with their heart and soul ripped out when industries moved away. Places that is where all meaningful employment for adults has already gone and in doing so, has taken away as well 'the future' for the next generation. Inevitably under such depressing circumstances, children society 'can't be asked' to nurture will instead be left to fester. That's criminal, considering just a few decades ago; Britain was the world's premier civilisation.

At the other end of the scale, where young Brits through sheer effort and determination, do gain a reasonable education despite the system. The government has been keen to channel 50% of these into higher education. Why, and what is the gain to politicians?

We've lost millions of jobs and these include the genuine apprenticeship, which was the traditional way young people entered craft industries. Those went when our industries fell like a series of dominoes, collapsing one after another. Our government meanwhile will do anything to dress up part time shelf stacking jobs and training schemes, as though they were worthy successors to the 'real jobs' we've lost. Job seekers allowance fits the bill nicely, where manipulated statistics are concerned. As do the huge numbers claiming 'disability' that are in reality, working the system for a free ride.

Packing the young off to universities for three years is yet another 'device' the government is utilising to disguise the truth about unemployment. Talk about cynical, they're encouraging our young to saddle themselves with an almighty debt, when the jobs they're hoping to get once they've gained a degree, probably no longer exist.

Bullying... disruption... political correctness... bureaucracy... hundreds of thousands abandoned in failing schools... half our young channelled into higher education, in disguise of unemployment statistics. How much worse could Britain fail its young and betray their futures?

Meanwhile the world is becoming ever more competitive, as well every other nation on earth knows. Our competitors are educating their young properly, whilst Britain falls behind to the point of grinding to a halt. So we've perfected the black art of becoming our own worst enemy? It's nothing to be proud of.

## **10 Policing and Justice**

Bearing in mind also the soft sentencing that precedes a cushioned landing in one of these places, just where is the deterrent? I can't see one. On the contrary, I think criminals are being cosseted. Lawyers are running amok claiming abuse of 'human rights' left, right and centre and in doing so, are helping themselves to ever more taxpayers cash. And the corporate interests of the private businesses running them are being looked after very well indeed. The result is no punishment, no reform, and lots of repeat custom, which is jolly good news for shareholders and just what anyone running an always full 'hotel' will want to hear.

In a nutshell... Effective policing has been undermined, therefore disabling the institutions ability to maintain civil order. Our legal trade is using both criminals and their victims as 'business assets'. Judiciary has lost the plot and is serving the interests of criminals better than victims. And 'Big Business' has muscled in, having identified a source of taxpayer funded wealth to be tapped into and exploited. Put it all together and what do you get? Lawlessness and the decent law abiding citizen left exposed and unprotected.

Then to add insult to injury, the chancellor mugs us for the vast amount of cash these failed institutions are demanding to run their 'services'. It's a joke, but one only a clique of super cynical businessmen are laughing at as they shovel yours and my tax monies into their own bank accounts. Time we got a grip!
